

# FY23 DoD Appropriations Memorandum | 22 December 2022

**BLUF:** The Senate and House Appropriations Committees have released *H.R.2617 Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2023* on December 20, 2022. This bill, if passed, will fund the federal government for the remainder of Fiscal Year 2023.

**Summary Funding:** The president's budget requests \$797.7B for the Department of Defense (DoD). Included in this funding is \$1.0 billion for NGREA, with \$335M designated for the Army National Guard (ARNG) and \$305.0 million designated for the Air National Guard (ANG).

# **Army National Guard**

- Funds ARNG end strength at 325,000 soldiers
   11,000 soldiers less than requested
- \$693.8M for modernization of 35 AH-64 Apache Block IIIA helicopters for the Army
   24 aircraft designated for the ARNG, consistent with PB request
- \$350M for 12 MQ-1C Gray Eagle for the National Guard
- \$923.4M for 35 UH-60M Black Hawk helicopters for the ARNG
   10 above request, all aircraft designated for the ARNG
- \$178.6M for 28 UH-60 Black Hawk L and V model helicopters for the ARNG
   Consistent with the PB request
- \$346.6M for 12 CH-47 Chinook F Block helicopters for the Army
   6 above PB request, none designated for the ARNG
- \$1.2B for the Abrams Upgrade program to modernize 67 M1 Abrams tanks
   46 above PB request
- \$891.1M for the Stryker upgrade program for the Army

- \$680M for 37 Paladin Integrated Management Systems for the Army
   13 designated for the ARNG, 10 above PB request
- \$120M ARNG HMMWV modernization program
- \$664M for 2,909 Joint Light Tactical Vehicles (JLTVs) for the Army
- \$459M for ARNG military construction (MILCON), includes funding for projects in 17 states

### **Air National Guard**

- Funds ANG end strength at 108,400 airmen

- \$1.7B for 16 C-130J Super Hercules aircraft for the ANG

- \$4.2B for 44 F-35A Lightning II aircraft for the Air Force
   11 above PB request, no aircraft designated for the ANG
- \$2.3B for 24 F-15EX aircraft for the Air Force
   Consistent with PB request, no aircraft designated for the ANG
- \$2.4B for 15 KC-46A Pegasus aircraft for the Air Force
   Consistent with PB request, no aircraft designated for the ANG
- \$1.2B for 20 HH-60W Combat Rescue Helicopters for the Air Force

- \$224.7M for C-130 modifications, including:
  - \$60.7 million for NP2000 propeller upgrades
  - \$41.2 million for T-56 series 3.5 engine upgrades
  - o \$20.0 million for Modular Airborne Firefighting System
- \$53M for F-16 AESA Radars for the Air National Guard
- Requires the Secretary of the Air Force to study aircraft to replace the LC-130 for the Polar Tactical Airlift mission
- Requires Secretary of the Air Force to submit a report detailing any plans to transfer space missions, personnel, or equipment of the National Guard to the Space Force.
- \$279.3M for ANG MILCON, includes funding for projects in 11 states
   \$130.4M above PB request

#### **Joint-Personnel**

- Funds a 4.6 percent military and civilian personnel pay raise
- \$85M in additional funding for National Guard Youth ChalleNGe program

- \$50M additional funding for National Guard STARBASE program
- \$10M in additional funding for National Guard Innovative Training program
- \$3M in additional funding for National Guard wildfire training
- \$8.2M in additional funding for ARNG State Partnership Program
- \$5.1M in additional funding for ANG State Partnership Program
- \$200.3M for the National Guard Counter-drug program
   \$100M increase above PB request
- \$25.8M for National Guard Counter-drug Schools
   \$20M increase above PB request
- Funds PFAS/PFOA contamination cleanup
- Funds advanced trauma and public health direct training services for the National Guard

# **Additional Provisions**

- Sec. 8019: Limits relocation of units to the NCR to \$500,000 during a single fiscal year. This provision can be waived by the Secretary of Defense on a case-by-case basis.
- Sec. 8044: Appropriates money for addressing sexual assault in the military.
- Sec. 8048: No funds may be used to reduce the authorized positions for military technicians (dual-status) of the ARNG, ANG, AR or AFR for the purpose of applying any administratively imposed civilian personnel ceiling, freeze, or reduction on military technicians.
- Sec. 8050: Funds may be used for reimbursement pay for National Guard and Reserve members when providing intelligence or counter-intelligence support to combatant commanders.
- Sec. 8057: CNGB may permit the use of equipment of the National Guard Distance Learning Project by any person or entity on a space-available, reimbursable basis.
- Sec. 8058: Limits funds for the retirement of C-40 aircraft.
- Sec. 8063: Guardsmen serving under Title 32 502(*f*) orders may perform duties in support of the ground-based elements of the National Ballistic Missile Defense System.
- Sec. 8065: CNGB may waive payment of all or part of the consideration required in lease of personal property for a period not in excess of 1 year to any specified organization or any youth, social, or fraternal nonprofit organization on a case-by-case basis.
